The beautiful kitchen pictured bottom left is painted in Little Greene's Basalt, a rich, dark shade that enhances the classic styling of the in-frame furniture. "Darker colours can create a warm atmosphere in a kitchen, both in the daytime and once the sun has gone down," continues Mark.



Ensuring that a colour doesn't overpower the room and works harmoniously with other elements is key and is something that Mark Taylor Design's experienced team excels at. "Light coloured worktops in materials such as Calacatta marble can provide a striking contrast against deeper, darker blues and can help to keep a space feeling light," advises Mark. "Alternatively, a pale blue kitchen with a light marble work surface can feel cold, so introducing warm materials, such as brass or copper, into a design can bring a real sense of luxury and warmth to a space." The pale blue kitchen pictured top left is painted in Little Greene Paint Company's James shade and features a copper-clad base for the seating area.
